- 1) A bespoke Women's Health Strategy for Wales
- 2) A long-term, sustainable commitment to the Wales Women's Health Implementation Group (WHIG) & Programme (WHIP)
- 3) Women's Health Hubs
- 4) Training of Healthcare Professionals
- 5) The Mandatory Inclusion of Menstrual Wellbeing Education on the School Curriculum for Wales
